## ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

The 1966-67 fall report shows a total enrollment increase of 6.2% over the fall semester a year ago. This is the smallest first semester increase since 1959-60. There is a 4.8% increase in undergraduates\*, an 11.2% increase in graduate students, and a 0.7% decline in professional students. The corresponding changes last year were: Undergraduates up 11.6%, graduates up 12.3%, and professionals up 2.5%

The small increase this fall reflects a substantial decline in new freshmen. New freshmen enrollment this year was 4719 compared to 5206 the previous year, a drop of 9.4%. This decline occurred only among resident new freshmen; 13.9% in resident men and 15.0% in resident women. Forty-five of the state's 72 counties had fewer new freshmen this year than last year. The non-resident new freshmen figure of 1824 is, coincidentally, exactly the same as it was the year before.

Resident students are 59.5% of the total compared to 61.6% last year. Sixty-nine percent of the undergraduates, 32.1% of the graduates, and 77.9% of the professionals are residents. Of the new freshmen, 61.3% are residents.

There are 1480 foreign students from 97 different countries. Foreign students are 1.3% of the undergraduates, 14.5% of the graduates, and 0.7% of the professional students. Thirty-three of these foreign countries had ten or more students on campus.

In connection with the recent policy of limiting non-resident undergraduate enrollment, two new tables are included this year. (XI and XII) These tables show resident and non-resident distribution based on the

Coordinating Committee for Higher Education's definition of non-residents (i.e. using permanent home address rather than fee assessments). The tables show that under this definition 29.0% of this fall's undergraduates are non-residents.

Women, while still outnumbered, continue to enroll at a higher rate than men:

Married students are 19.5% of the total student body; 7.8% of the undergraduates are married, 48.2% of the graduates, and 38.9% of the professionals.

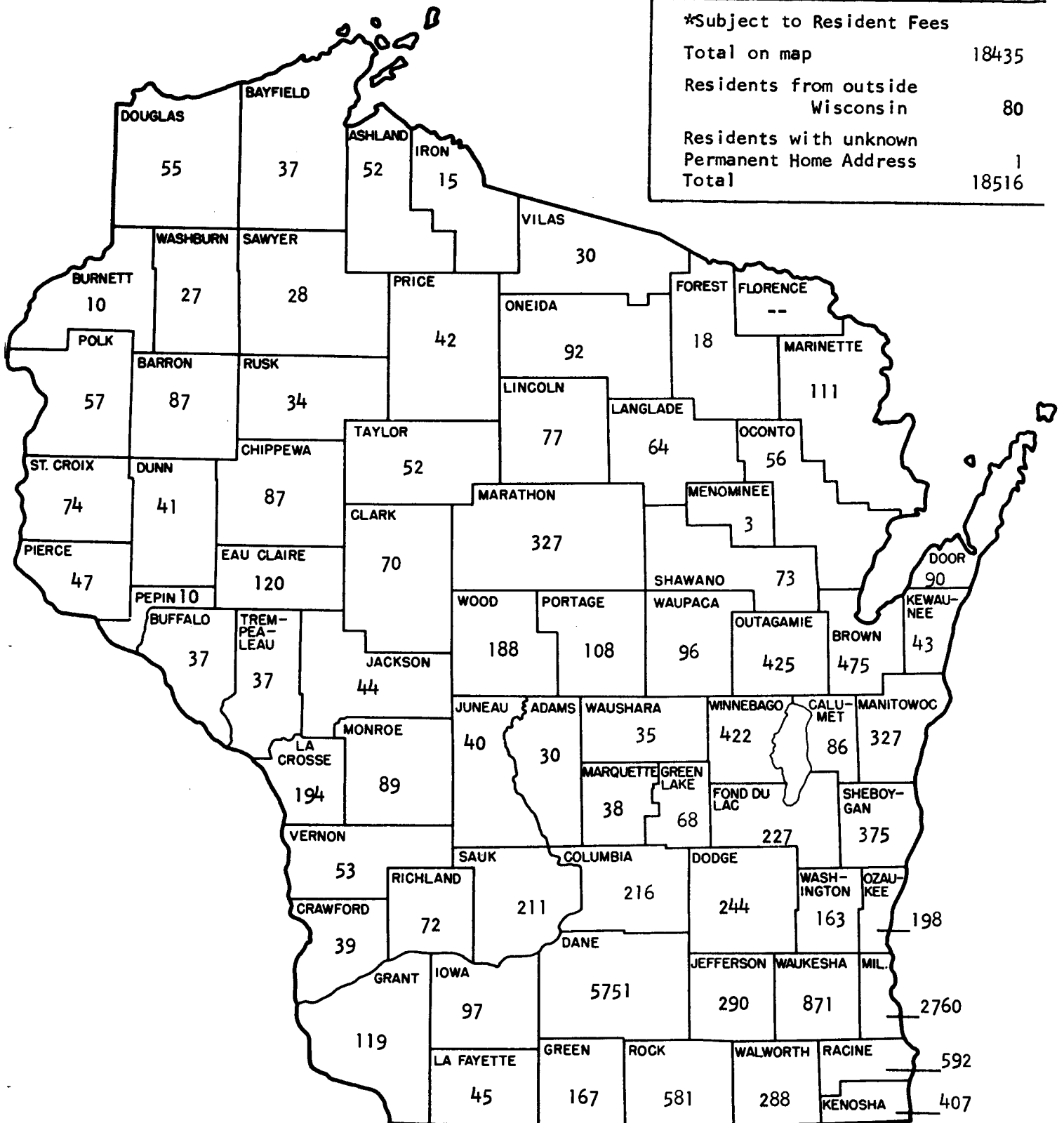
