BY SEX AND RESIDENT STATUS*

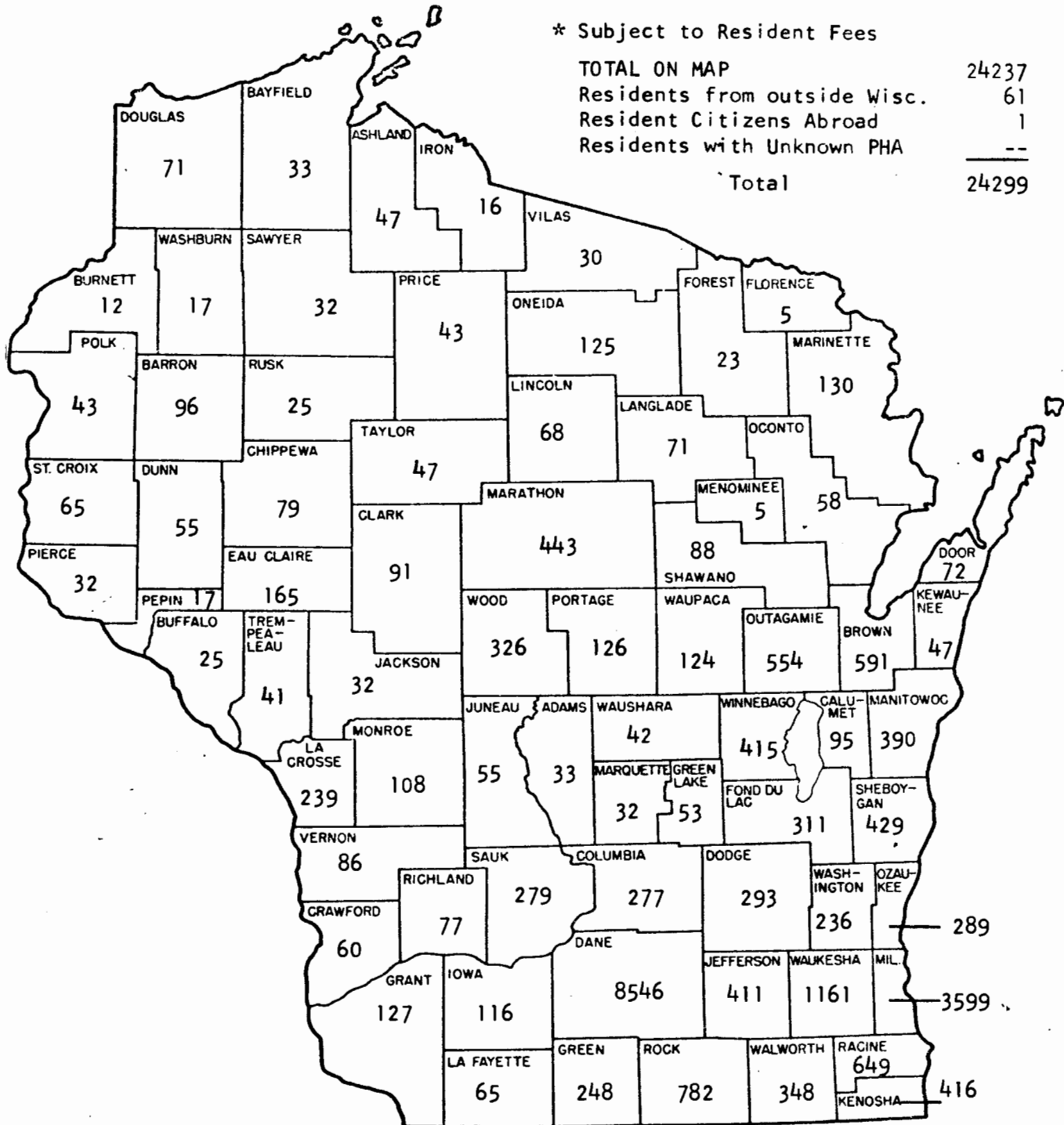

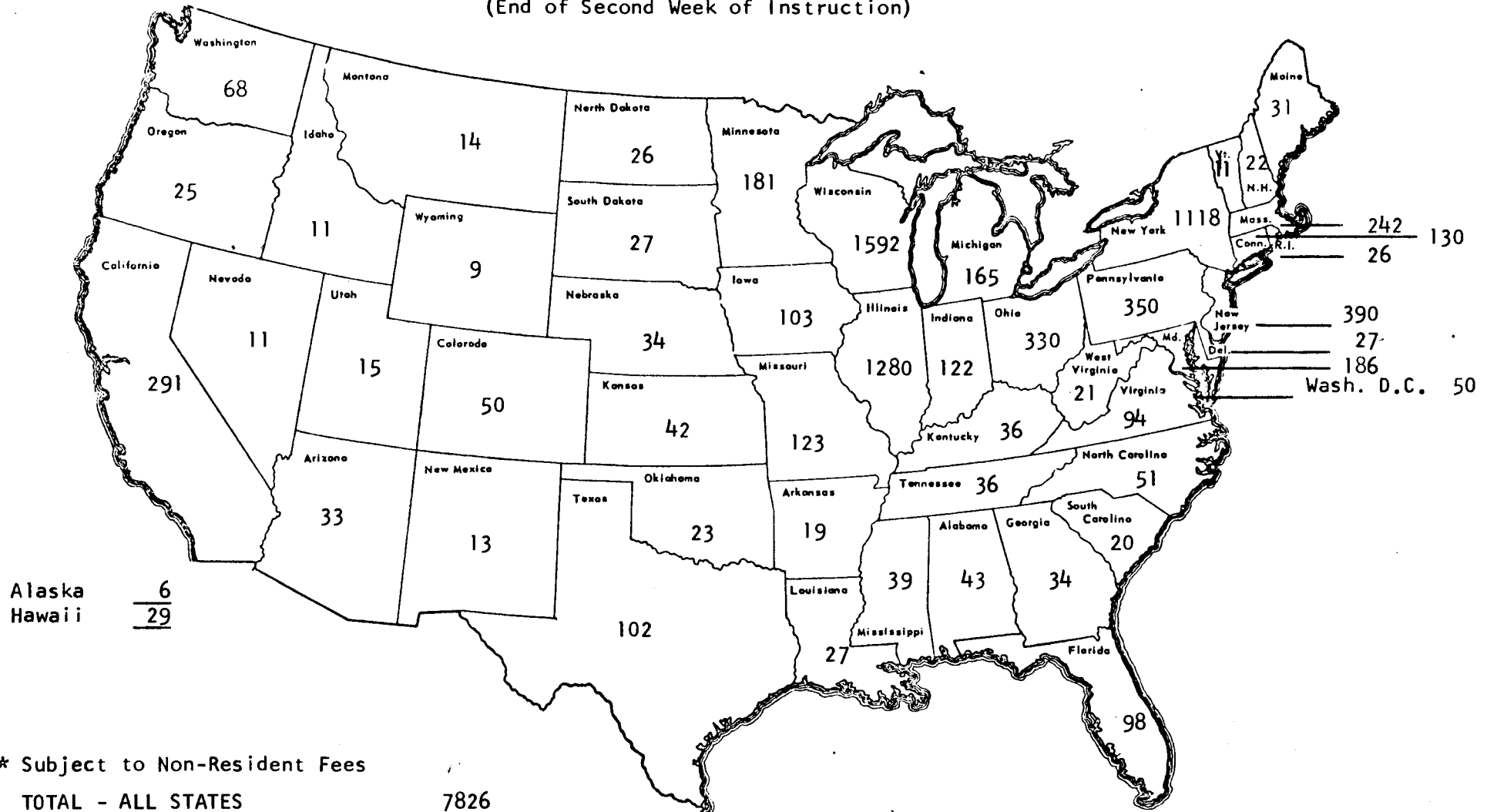
