EXPLANATORY NOTES

Beginning with the Second Semester of 1971-72 two new groups of students are being included in the Enrollment Reports.

1. Dissertators.
2. General Specials.

1. Dissertators

On August 6, 1971, the Regents of the University of Wisconsin passed legislation requiring continuous registration for graduate students who are doctoral candidates but, having completed all course, residence requirements, and preliminary examinations, are no longer engaged in use of University laboratory, office, or library facilities as a primary activity, and do not hold University appointments. The registration fee is intended to reflect true average costs of record maintenance, correspondence, faculty time and occasional use of University facilities by students who have not completed their theses but are primarily employed in activities other than work on their doctorates. (1) These students, even though they may be non-residents, pay for the one credit of work at the resident fee rate.

This semester 766 dissertators are registered. They are enrolled by college or school as follows:

2. General Specials

These are students in a new "experimental program that will facilitate men and women taking occasional courses for personal and professional enrichment without need to qualify as degree candidates."

These students are different than the college specials, who are associated with a particular school or college. The college special is 1) really seeking admission as a degree candidate but is currently making up deficiencies, or 2) working toward teacher certification, or 3) taking a short terminal program leading to transfer to another training institution.

In view of the decline in college specials (Table II), it appears that some students who formerly would have enrolled as college specials now enroll as General Specials.

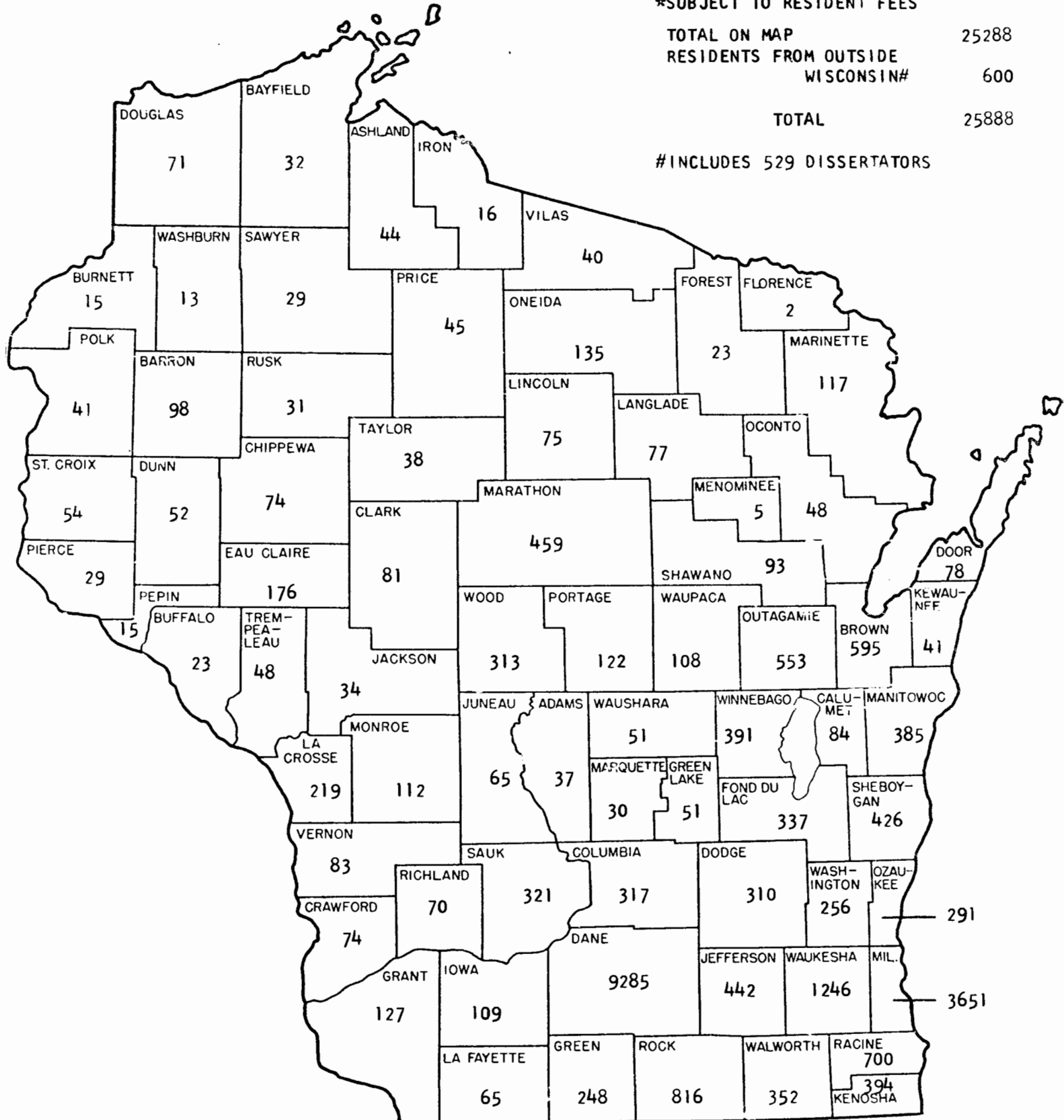

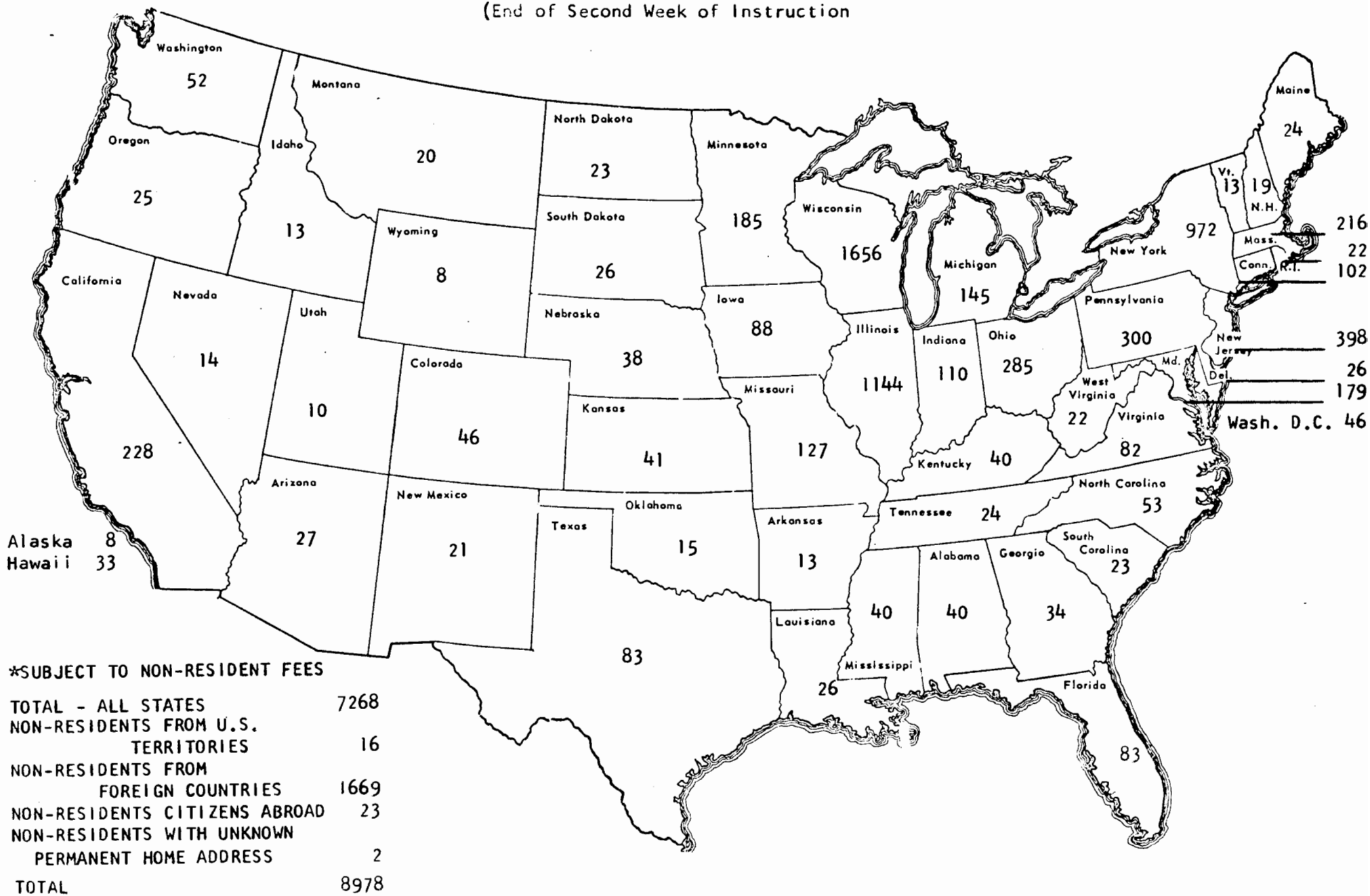
