EXPLANATORY NOTES

Beginning with the First Semester 1973-74, we are including a new classification - that of the Guest student (GUES) - in the Enrollment Report. In the tables which report enrollment by college or school, the General Special and Guest students are shown under the heading of "Inter-College Program Office" in recognition of the fact that that office exercises jurisdiction over both categories. There are two types of Guest students:

- a) Those 65 years of age and over and residents of Wisconsin are eligible to enroll for a maximum of two courses on an audit only basis free of charge.
- b) Those under 65 years of age, regardless of residence status, may enroll for courses on an audit only basis and be assessed at a cost of one-half the instructional fee appropriate to their status.

There are a total of 82 Guest students registered this semester. They are reported together with the General Special students on all but two of the tables in this report. (Namely, Tables III and XIV).

Effective this semester, the status of full-time and part-time students is being reported so as to conform with the definitions used by the Graduate School. For example, a PhD. candidate who has passed preliminary examinations and residence requirements must register for two credits. In previous reports that student was reported as part-time since the definition of a part-time student is one enrolled for seven credits or less. Under rules of the Graduate School, that student is considered to be full-time and is being so reported here. In like manner, teaching assistants who are carrying at least six credits will be reported as full-time students.

Data on the full-time and part-time split will be shown in the "Facts at a Glance" table and in the part-time enrollment table on page

The table on Intercampus Transfers has been revised this year to indicate the campuses within the U.W. System from which the students have transferred.

Under an interstate compact recently approved, residents of Wisconsin and Minnesota may attend a school in the other state and be assessed fees on a resident basis. For purposes of this report, however, students from Minnesota attending the Madison Campus under the compact are classified and shown as non-residents.

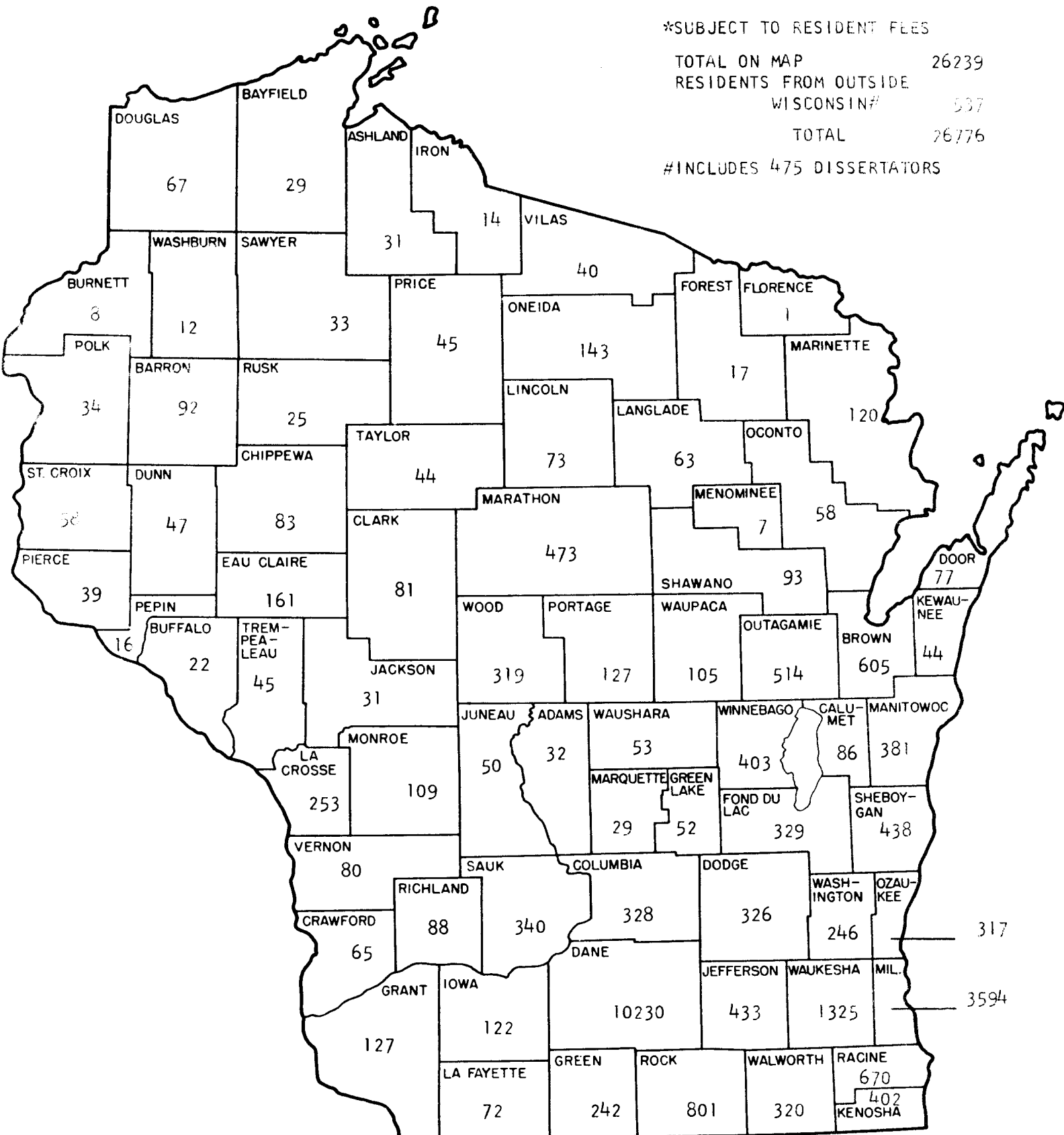

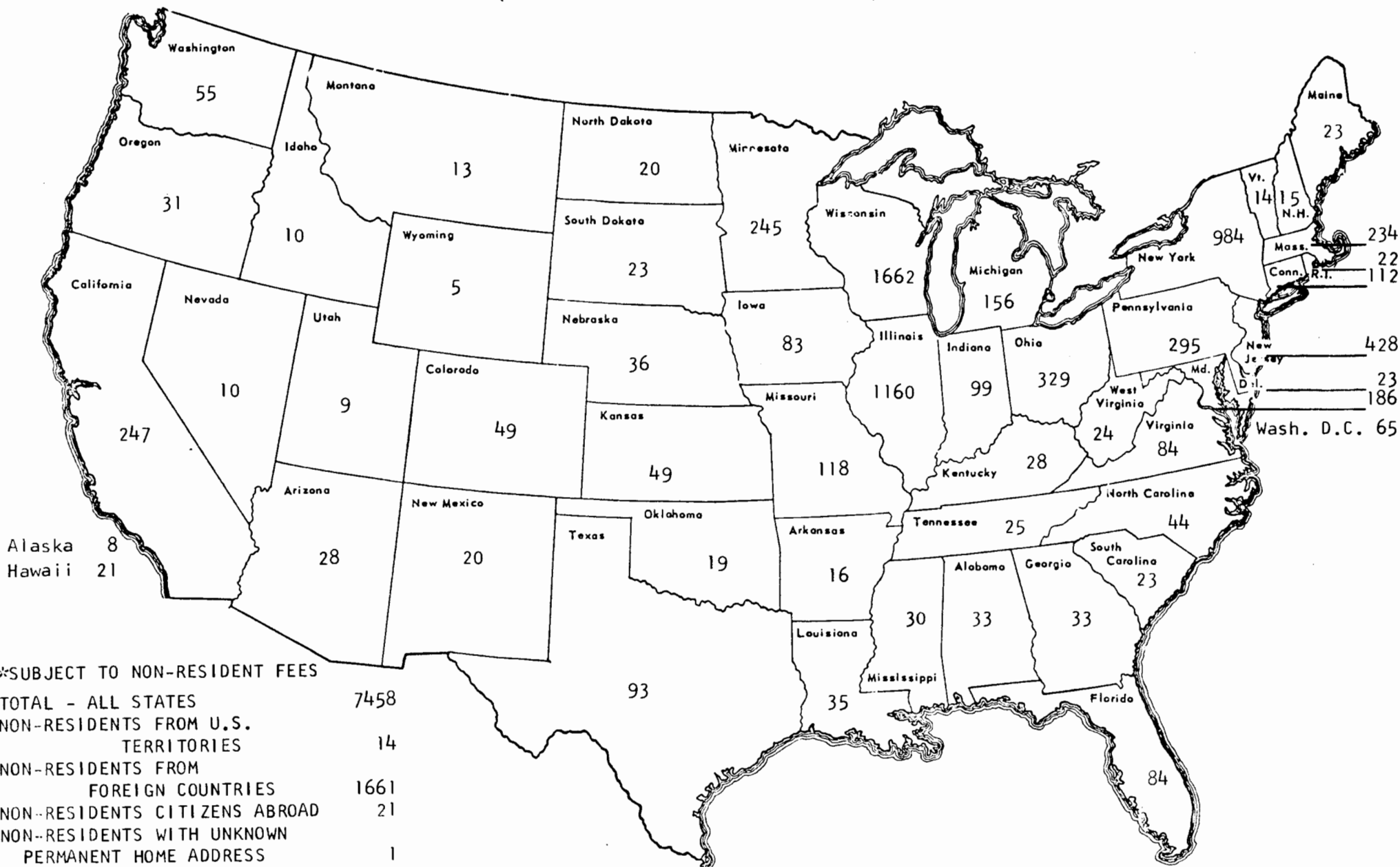
