EXPLANATORY NOTES

Married students are not being reported this semester on the Facts Table, nor is there a separate table for them as in previous years. This is because we can no longer request data on marital status on the new student application form (per Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972). We were also unable to collect these data from Registration Forms because the present format does not allow for corrections in marital status.

We no longer report the Integrated Liberal studies students because this classification has now been discontinued.

Students referred to as General Specials (GENS) in previous reports have now had their name changed to University Specials (UNS).

Pre-elementary Education is now reported under the School of Education rather than the College of Letters and Science.

There is a discrepancy between the Age Table for this year as compared to last year due to the fact that on last year's a January 31st cut-off was actually used despite the reported cut-off date of August 31.

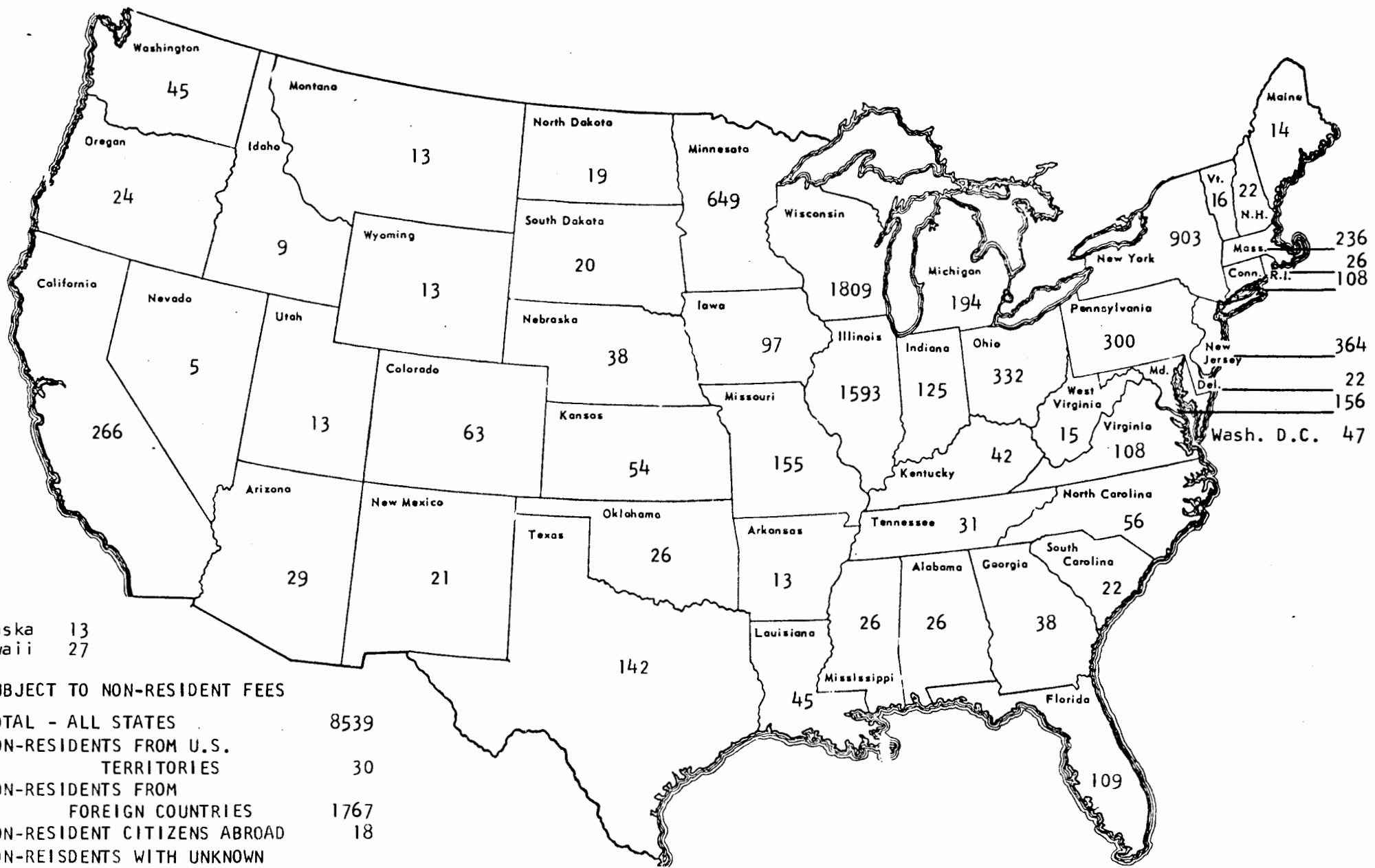
