## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### FIRST SEMESTER 1978-79

The criteria for students enrolled as Dissertators in the Graduate School has changed to include all Graduate Students who have passed their preliminary examinations, satisfied the Graduate School residence requirement, and completed their minor. Prior to this semester Dissertators met the prelim and residence requirement and were employed full-time.

In previous years the College of Engineering required that a student attain 96 credits and 192 grade points for senior standing. This has now been changed to 86 credits and 172 grade points and corresponds with the other Schools' and Colleges' definition of senior standing.

Beginning this semester graduate-level students in medically-related majors and graduate-level students with a major of Legal Institutions are listed as Graduates in the Schools of Medicine and Law respectively. These graduate-level students were previously listed as Graduates in the College of Letters & Science. These students are tallied as Graduate Students and not Professional Students.

The School of Allied Health Professions now distinguishes between their pre-professional students and their majors in Medical Technology. Previously, all students with a major of Medical Technology were classified as MDT (Medical Technology). As of this semester, students in the pre-professional portion of the program are listed as PMT (Pre-Medical Technology) and students in the professional portion of the program are listed as MDT (Medical Technology).

The College of Agricultural & Life Sciences has established two new classifications for their students majoring in Landscape Architecture. ALA (Landscape Architecture) is for students admitted to the "professional Landscape Architecture" major and PLA (Pre-Landscape Architecture) is for newly-entering students interested in being considered for formal admission at a later time into the "ALA" classification. Previously these students were listed as ALS (Agriculture- 4 Year Course) students.

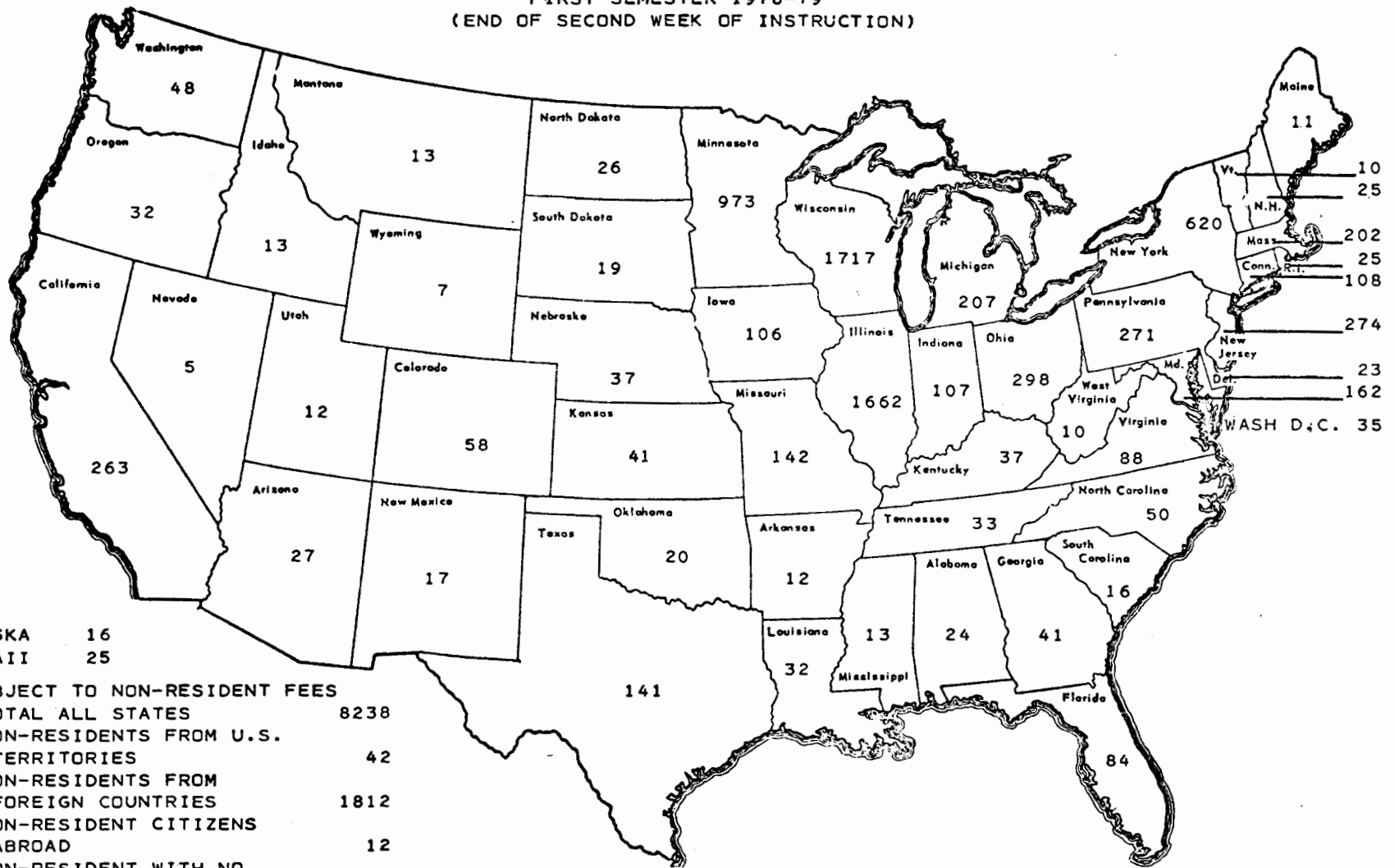
